Is Strep Causing That Sore Throat?

“My throat hurts!” That’s not a phrase any parent wants to hear, and their first guess is often strep throat. Here’s what you need to know about strep throat and how to prevent it.

What is strep throat?

Strep throat (or Group A Streptococcal pharyngitis) is a common illness in children, but can affect people at any age. It is caused by the Group A *Streptococcus pyogenes* bacteria and usually starts with a sudden onset of sore throat, pain when swallowing, swollen lymph nodes in the neck, and fever. Also, small red



or white spots can appear at the back of the throat or on the tonsils. Most cases happen in the winter and spring, but strep throat can occur at any time of year.

How does it spread?

The bacteria that cause strep throat are very contagious. Strep throat spreads through mucus droplets when a sick person coughs or sneezes, shares food and drink, or touches other surfaces (like doorknobs and toys) with unwashed hands. The germ can infect you when it comes in contact with your eyes, nose, or mouth.

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
